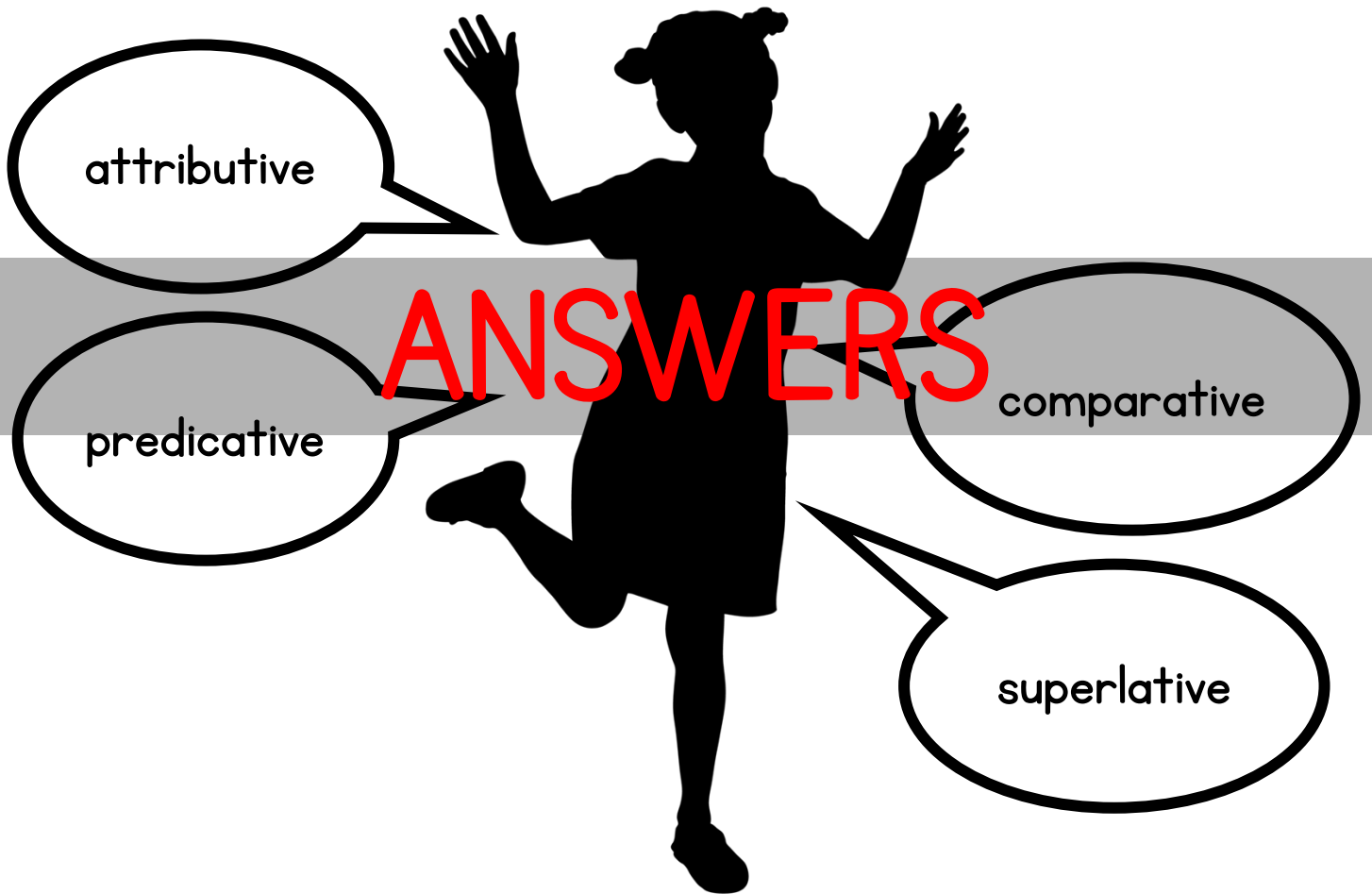

An adjective is a word that describes a noun.

TYPES OF ADJECTIVES

ATTRIBUTIVE

- Stands before a noun and describes it. For eg:

The red bag is mine.

↓ ↓
adjective noun

PREDICATIVE

- Stands after a noun and there's a verb separates it from the noun it describes. For eg:

The coffee is sweet.

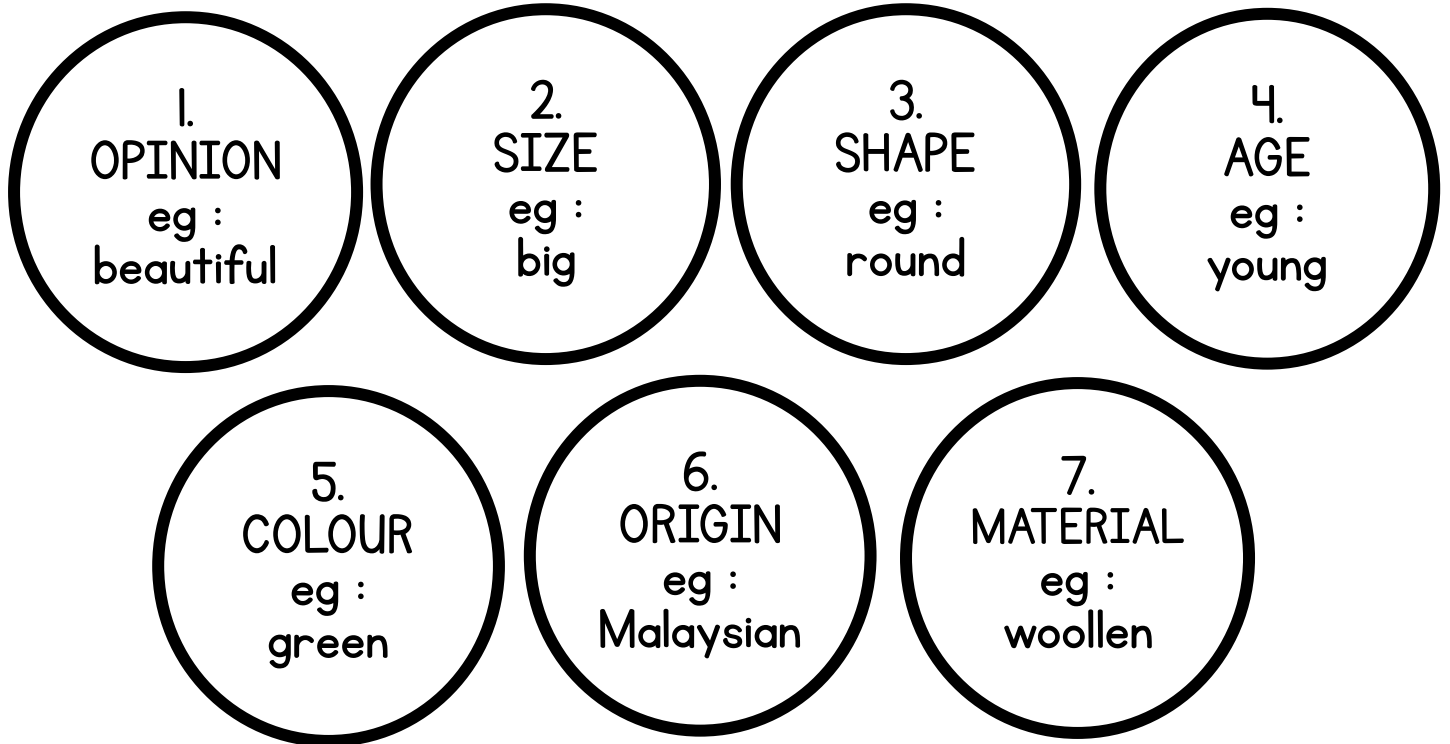
ADJECTIVE	COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVE (compares two nouns)	SUPERLATIVE ADJECTIVE (compares MORE than two nouns)
ONE syllable	add "er"	add "est"
fast	faster <u>er</u>	the fastest <u>est</u>
young	younger <u>er</u>	the youngest <u>est</u>
ONE syllable : ending in "e"	add "r"	add "st"
nice	nicer <u>er</u>	the nicest <u>est</u>
strange	stranger <u>er</u>	the strangest <u>est</u>
ONE syllable : consonant + short vowel + consonant	Double the last consonant and add "er"	Double the last consonant and add "est"
big	bigger <u>er</u>	the biggest <u>est</u>
hot	hotter <u>er</u>	the hottest <u>est</u>
TWO syllables ending in "y"	Remove the "y" and add "ier"	Remove the "y" and add "iest"
happy	happier <u>er</u>	the happiest <u>est</u>
crazy	crazier <u>er</u>	the craziest <u>est</u>
TWO or MORE syllables	Add "more" before the adjective	Add "the most" before the adjective
famous	<u>more</u> famous	<u>the most</u> famous
beautiful	<u>more</u> beautiful	<u>the most</u> beautiful

EXCEPTIONS (IRREGULAR ADJECTIVE)

good	better	the best
bad	worse	the worst
far	further	the furthest
little	less	the least
many	more	the most

Order of adjectives

When more than one adjective comes before a noun, the adjectives are NORMALLY in this particular order:



Examples:

(2) (5) (7)

1. The big red woollen blanket is for my mother.

(1) (6)

2. Mei Ling is a beautiful Chinese girl.

(2) (6) (7)

3. Mr Tom bought a huge Indonesian wooden chair.
