

## accordion

A musical instrument that you squeeze together and pull apart. It has lots of buttons and keys to press to make music.

accordion

### classical music

A type of music that's been around for a long time, often played by a big group of musicians with instruments like violins and pianos.

### folk music

Music that comes from the traditions of a country or community. It's often played with guitars and tells stories about everyday life.

## perform

To show off a talent, like singing, dancing or acting, usually in front of an audience.

### pop music

A popular kind of music that lots of people like, usually with catchy tunes and easy-to-remember words.

## promote

To help something become more popular, like telling lots of people about a new song or a concert.

### rap

A type of music where words are spoken quickly and rhythmically over a beat, instead of being sung.

# rhythm

The beat that you tap your feet to in a song.

### tour

When singers or bands travel to different places to perform their music.

### tune

A melody or a series of notes in music that are easy to remember.



#### possible

When something can be done or achieved. It means that it could happen or be true.

#### <u>impossible</u>

The opposite of possible. It means something cannot be done or achieved, no matter how hard someone tries.



#### agree

When you have the same opinion as someone else or you say 'yes' to an idea or suggestion.

#### disagree

The opposite of agree. It's when you have a different opinion from someone else or you say 'no' to an idea or suggestion.





#### polite

Showing good manners and respect towards others. It's about being kind and considerate in how you act and speak.

#### impolite

Not showing good manners. It means being rude or disrespectful in your behaviour or speech.




#### perfect

When something is completely without any mistakes or flaws. It's as good as it can possibly be.

#### <u>imperfect</u>

The opposite of perfect. It means having mistakes or flaws, not being completely perfect.



#### mature

When someone behaves in a grown-up way, showing good judgement and responsibility. It's about being sensible and not childish.

#### immature

The opposite of mature. It means behaving in a childish or silly way, not acting like a grown-up.



#### respect

Showing consideration and appreciation towards others. It's about treating people, their feelings, and their things in a thoughtful and kind way.

#### disrespect

The opposite of respect. It means not showing consideration or appreciation, often behaving rudely or offensively towards others.

Practicing for a performance, like a play or a concert, before the actual event.

### a musical

## cheerful

Music or sounds that are happy and make you feel good.

# lively

Music that is full of energy and makes you want to move or dance.

# optimistic

Music that sounds hopeful and positive.

### romantic

Music or movies that are about love and feelings.

## romantic film

A movie about love stories. usually with happy endings.

### action film

A movie with lots of exciting scenes, like chases, fights and adventures.

## comedy

A film or show that's funny and makes you laugh.

### horror film

A scary movie that's meant to frighten and surprise you.
