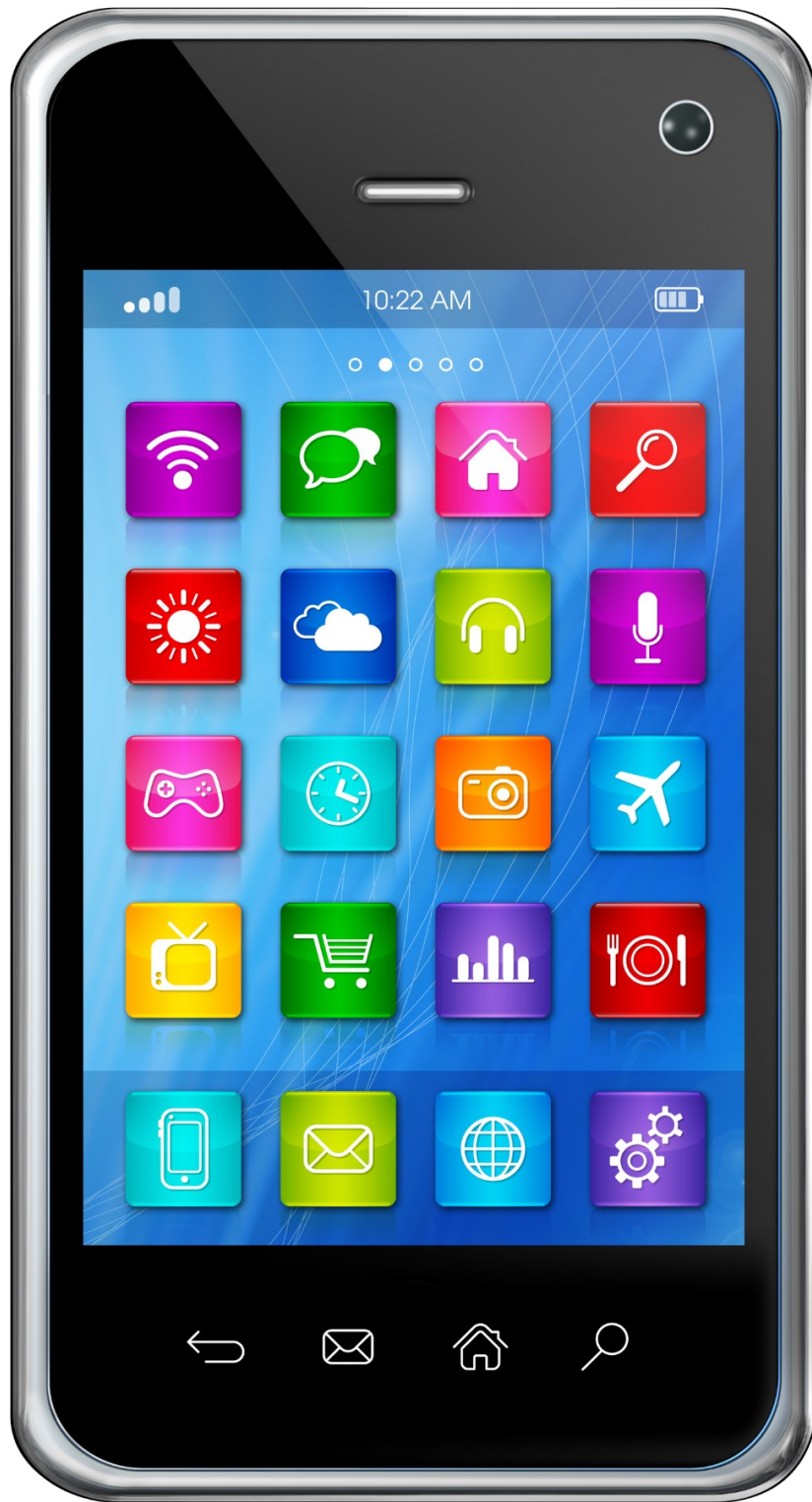

barcode

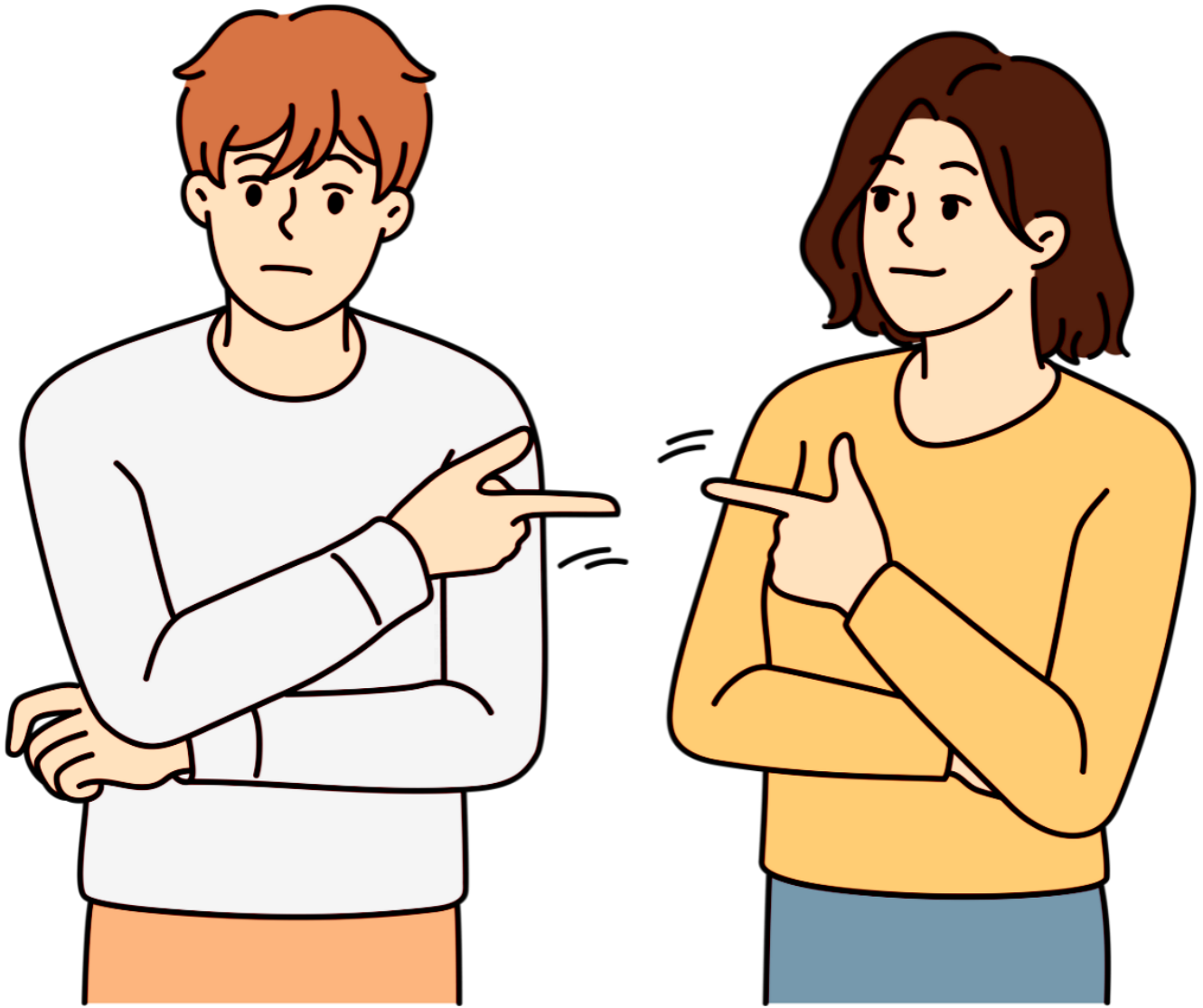
A set of lines of different widths and spaces you see on products. When scanned, it tells information like the price.

blame

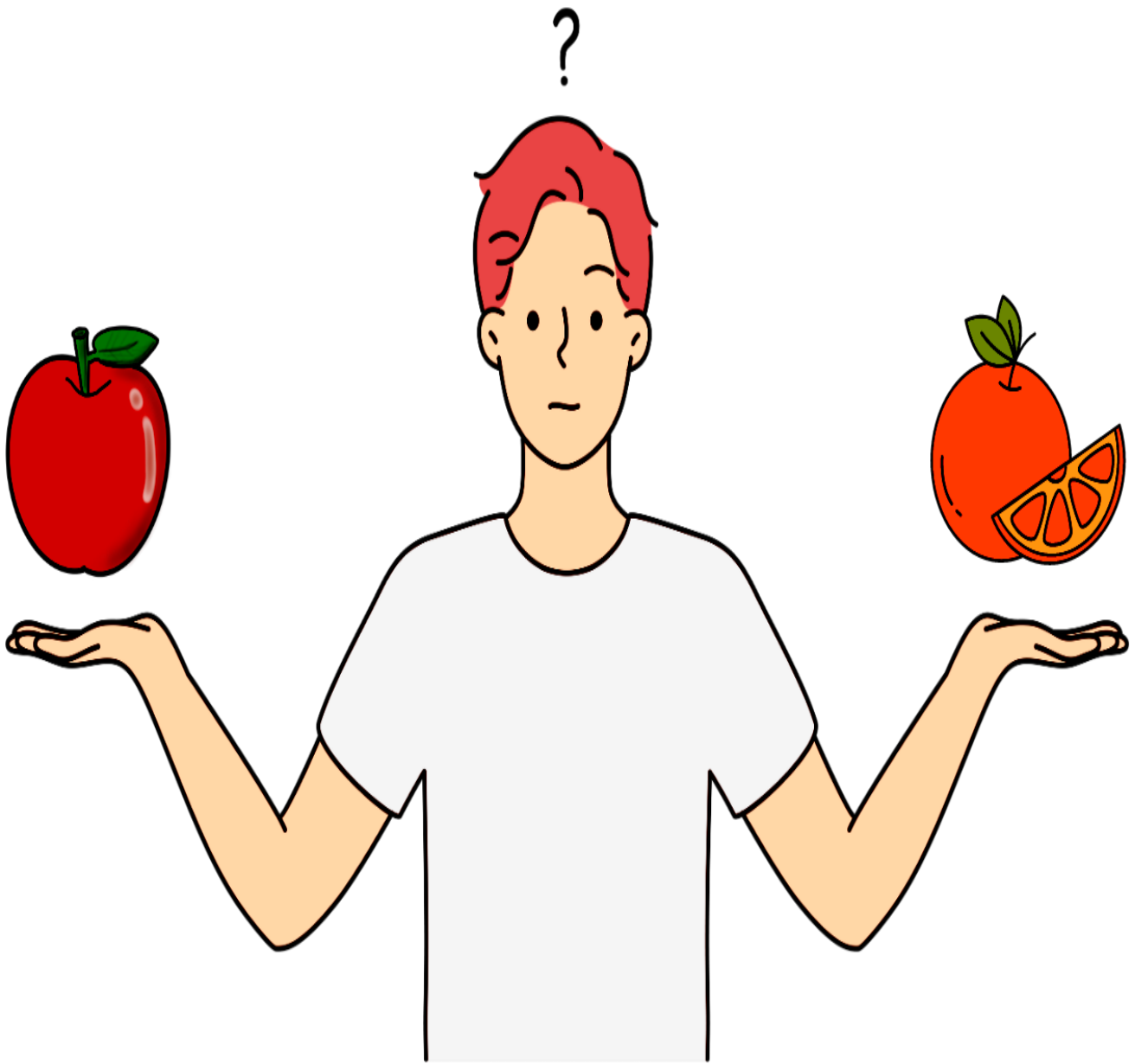
Saying someone

sweet

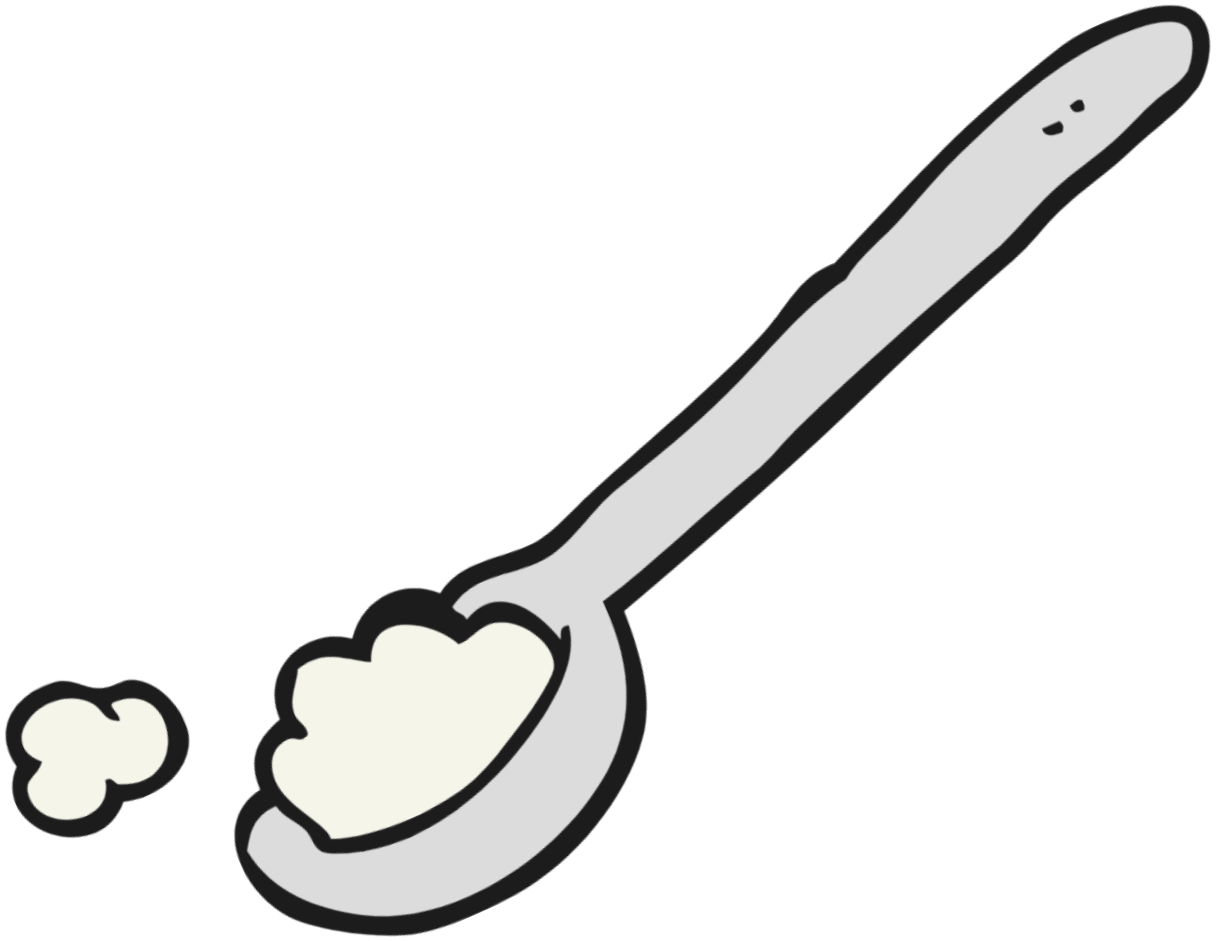
Tasting like

An unspecified item or thing; it's more specific than 'anything' but still not detailed.
